“On that day a fountain will be opened to the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, to cleanse them from sin and impurity.”

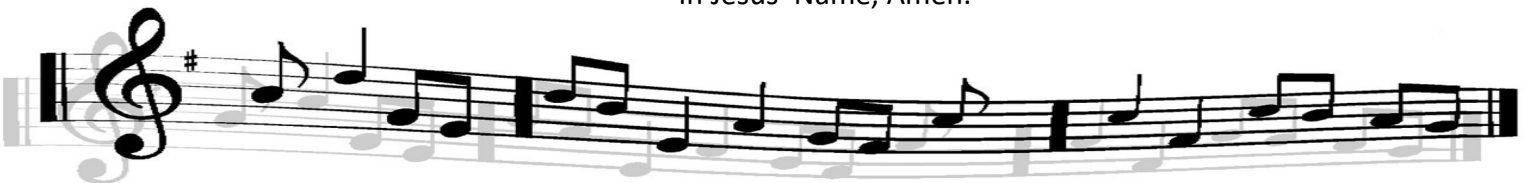
William Cowper was born in Great Berkhamstead, Hertfordshire, England, in 1731. He was educated in private schools as a small child and at Westminster School, earning a degree in law. William Cowper was physically frail and emotionally sensitive throughout his childhood. One of the traumatic experiences was the death of his mother when he was only six years old. He never stopped grieving for his mother. He was placed in an insane asylum for a period of eighteen months after a few breakdowns. While confined in the asylum he would spend much of his time reading Scriptures. He often struggled with the question of his salvation and peace with God. He accepted Christ at the age of 33 after reading Romans 3:23 and realizing that he was a sinner and needed Christ. He later would attend the church of John Newton, who wrote “Amazing Grace,” and they wrote many poems together. One day, reading Zechariah 13:1, William began to write the poem “There is a Fountain.” It was then he realized we are completely covered by Christ's blood. As we had stood in a fountain.

Lord, thank You for allowing Mr. Cowper to see how You have covered us with Your blood.

You are an amazing God who has saved us from us sin through the blood of Jesus.

Read Romans 3:23-25

For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God; being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: Whom God set forth to be a satisfaction through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God." --Romans 3:23-25

Believe in Christ as your Savior and you can be washed white as snow. Nothing can make you whole again but Jesus and the sacrifice that He made for you.

Lord, please forgive me for all my sins. I believe in You and ask You to make me more like You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Day 5
