SERVES OVERVIEW

God's name is more than identification— it's a description of his character. In this four-week study on a few of the many names God is called throughout Scripture, we learn who God is and what that means for us today. God is our provider, our shepherd, a banner, and our great healer.

God is more than just our Lord and Savior. The bible teaches that He is also our great provider. He provides for our physical, emotional, and most importantly our spiritual needs. In this first week of the new series, we look at how God provides for us. He doesn't just simply give us what we want but he knows what we need. Because he created us, he knows how to provide for us.

God as our provider does not mean that he is just a magic genie in a bottle doing all that we want. Rather, because he knows us and created us, he knows what we need. This week practice asking for God's desires. Thank God become your desires. Thank God for how he has provided for you and remember his provision as it helps keep our hearts and minds focused on his heart rather than our sinfulness.

Were Dus

More commonly known by its meaning rather than the name itself, Jehova Rohi - The Lord our Shepherd, found in Psalm 23, reveals the loving, patient, and protective nature of our Lord! A shepherd, by practice, is someone who cares for a flock, leading them to safe pastures, protecting them from danger. And David, the guy who wrote Psalm 23, totally got this! He was a shepherd himself for many years, so he knew exactly what it meant to care for and protect his flock, even facing down lions and bears. So when David calls the Lord his Shepherd, he's drawing from this experience, knowing exactly what it means to be in the Shepherd's care.

In describing God as his Shepherd, David also acknowledges his own role as a sheepbependent vulnerable in need of guidance. Without the Shepherd, he would be lost! And this image isn't
just David's reality; it's ours as well. We, too, are like sheep, in need God's constant guidance, care, and
protection. So let's rejoice in the comfort that comes from knowing Jehova Rohi - our Lord who loves
us, guides us, and protects us.

GIALLENGE

Read Psalm 23 and sit with the verses and the Lord for a minute. How incredible is it to know that God doesn't just watch from a distance but is our Jehova Rohi? He's right here, guiding, protecting, and leading us every step of the way. And through Jesus, by making him Lord of our lives, He's extended this gift to each of us! So, this week let's celebrate and walk in the confidence found in knowing that we have a Shepherd who knows us cares for us and never leaves our side!

APPLICATION
